It was exciting to live vicariously through Bob Britt as he embarked on a cross country adventure in his twin Comanche. He departed on his solo flight at around noon on Friday, September 8<sup>th</sup>. The first leg of his flight took him west across the state and Lake Michigan with a refueling stop in Algona, IA. The next leg took him further west to Cheyenne, WY where he spent the night. His third leg took him to Fillmore, UT for more fuel and then onto Camarillo, in southern CA to visit a friend. On September 11<sup>th</sup> he flew to visit yet another friend in Marina, in northern CA. On September 13<sup>th</sup> he flew to Truckee, CA to watch the National Championship Air Races in Reno. He started his return trip on the 18<sup>th</sup> with a stop in Logan, UT and then onto Valentine, NE and Red Wing, MN before returning to 6D9. He said he only burned three quarts of oil between two engines on the flight. He was glad he did the flight and enjoyed meeting up with friends from Delta he hadn't see in a while.
